

The Architectural History of McCormick School

Join local historian and realtor, Lisa Yako, for a presentation and discussion about the history of McCormick School. Built in 1943, McCormick (then called Huron School) was designed with unique architectural flair and constructed using state of the art building techniques. McCormick was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 2011. This summer, the Huron community is celebrating McCormick School's 75th anniversary at a Diamond Jubilee event on Saturday, August 4. All are welcome.

Algal Blooms

Lake Erie algal blooms are a significant sign the Lake is in trouble, but some people may not realize the role each individual plays in the health the Lake, and in helping to reduce algae. Learn more about the condition of the Lake, how it got this way, and how it compares to previous issues from the 1960s. What is all this talk about immigration? Who exactly are these DREAMers and why is the DREAM Act such a big deal? What's DACA? Why don't people just become citizens and be done with it? Patricia Y. Hernández, Senior Attorney at Advocates for Basic Legal Equality, Inc. (ABLE), will provide an introduction to basic immigration law and concepts, with a brief Q & A following.

Great Romances in Classical Music

Recently recognized for excellence by the Ohio Arts Council, writer and storyteller Mark Sebastian Jordan will talk about love and the mark it has left on great pieces of classical music. These range from the first surviving piece of notated music in human history to the secret messages encoded in works by Beethoven, Elgar, Shostakovich, and more. One recently discovered code was the reference in the last movement of Antonin Dvorak's Cello Concerto in B minor to the secret unrequited love of his life for his sister-in-law, who died while he was writing the work. The talk will feature musical excerpts and pictures.

Medicare 101

Presented by Carrie Nunnari of TLC Insurance Group and TLC, this presentation will discuss the basics of Medicare, detailing who can enroll in Medicare and how and when to enroll. It will review Original Medicare (Parts A & B), Medicare Advantage Plans (Part C), and Prescription Drug Plans (Part D); discuss the different Election Periods; and explain Medical Supplements or Medigap plans. Lastly, learn who is eligible for Medicare Savings Plans or Extra Help, and how they apply.

The Ohio Navy

Did you know there is an Ohio Navy? Created in 1896, the Ohio Naval Brigade was a branch of the Ohio National Guard, serving as an Auxiliary Reserve to the United States Navy. Later renamed the Ohio Naval Militia, and commonly known today as the Ohio Navy, they provide security around Camp Perry and support state and federal forces. Members receive a wide variety of training and participate in military appreciation and support events. Learn about the history of Ohio's naval forces, the Ohio Navy's current mission, and the unique opportunities available for Ohio residents to serve the community as members of the state's naval defense force.

A Change Is Gonna Come: Popular Music and Social Change in the 1960s

The 1960s were a decade of social change in the United States, with protests against the Vietnam War, the birth of the hippie movement, the burgeoning women's movement, and the ongoing Civil Rights movement. Musicians, especially pop and rock artists, responded to these changes in their music and created some of our most enduring songs of protest during that era. Join Dr. David Lewis, Sound Archivist at the Bowling Green State University Music Library and Bill Schurk Sound Archives, to explore the history and ongoing impact of the protest music of the 1960s. Examine how different artists responded to the social and cultural changes of the era.
